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Call for Abstracts

Closing date: Friday, 30 March 2012

Abstracts are invited for oral and poster presentation for the Australian & New Zealand Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons 2012 Conference. The full scope of oral and maxillofacial surgery will be considered, including:

- Clinical Practice
- Challenges and Innovations
- Education and Research
- Orthognathic Surgery (with particular reference to planning and navigated surgery)
- Temporomandibular Joint Disorders
- Implants (use of computer planning, difficulties with ridge augmentation)
- Orthodontics (use of mini anchorage to assist surgical cases; space creation vs space closure for congenitally missing teeth; orthognathic planning and decision making regarding surgical set-up and finishing)
- Trauma
- Pathology (benign or malignant)

Instructions for Authors

Abstracts can only be submitted online, via the ANZAOMS Conference website www.anzaomsconference.com.au.

When you submit your abstract you will be given an Access Key – please make a note of this key. If you wish to submit a new abstract or replace an existing abstract (before the closing date) you can do so through the Speakers Zone on the website.

1. Prepare your abstract

Abstracts must be typed in English and use a 12 point Times New Roman font with single line spacing. Abstracts must not exceed 300 words, excluding title, authors and institutions. The complete title should be in capitals, underline the presenting author only, do not include titles or degrees. Author(s) and institution(s), city, state and country, in capital/lower case letters, should follow the title.

The abstract should include the essential technical qualities of the paper or poster. No figures, acknowledgements or references are required with the abstract. The presenting author's name must be underlined.

- Abstracts may include a simple table or figure.
- The abstract must include a succinct overview of the intent and purpose of the presentation.
- Preference will be given to papers outlining results of research or quality-related projects.





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- A structured abstract format is preferred but not mandatory with the following headings:
 - Background
 - Objectives (or Hypotheses)
 - Methods
 - Principal Findings
 - Conclusion (or Discussion)

References should be used sparingly. All abbreviations should be given in brackets after the first full use of the word.

Please note that it is a requisite for all accepted abstract presenting authors to register for the ANZAOMS 2012 Conference.

2. Register your abstract

To submit your abstract, visit the ANZAOMS Conference website www.anzaomsconference.com.au.

Following the instructions under the call for abstracts tab, you will be asked to enter your contact details, abstract title, author(s), etc. You can submit multiple abstracts at this point.

3. Upload your abstract

At the end of the registration process you will be asked to upload your Microsoft Word abstract document. Authors will receive email confirmation of submission success and a follow-up email from the ANZAOMS 2012 Conference Secretariat.

4. Amending your abstract

Changes can be made to your word document and then re-uploaded using the Speaker Zone area on the website before the closing date.

Notification of Abstract Status

An acknowledgment email will be sent within 7 days of receipt of your abstract.

After the review process, an acceptance/decline notification email will be sent to the nominated contact for the abstract by early May 2012.
