# SPEAKERS



**Professor Brant E. Fries, PhD  
- United States of America**

Brant is a Professor of Health Management and Policy at the School of Public Health and Research Professor at the Institute of Gerontology, University of Michigan, and Chief of Health Systems Research for the Geriatric Research, Education, and Clinical Center at the Ann Arbor VA Medical Center. He is the President of interRAI and a principal author of the Resource Utilization Groups (RUG-III) system for classifying nursing home residents, used nationwide in the United States (US) for payment to nursing homes. Recently he lead a major project across the USA to revise this instrument, which will soon be released as RUG-IV. His areas of work are in developing intake and triage systems based on interRAI instruments, and in developing a supplement to the mental health instrument for application in prisons.

of that same university. Her research mainly focuses on care for elderly people, in terms of innovation and quality improvement. In Belgium, she manages a government sponsored project to research the conditions in which interRAI LTCF and InterRAI HC could be implemented at a national level. She is also involved in a project concerning the use of the interRAI AC. She became an associated interRAI Fellow in 2007.



**Dr Harriet Finne-Soveri, MD,  
PhD - Finland**

A geriatric consultant, graduated from the University of Helsinki in 1980. Harriet became board-certified in geriatric medicine in 1994. She has been involved in research and publications in the geriatric field since 1982 and in 1995 began research with the MDS. At present, Dr. Finne-Soveri is the Chief Medical Officer and Managing Director in the largest nursing home in Helsinki, Finland. She also is a Senior Lecturer at the University of Helsinki, Finland, and has been on the medical faculty in geriatric medicine since 1993. Her other appointments include Researcher at the National Research and Development Centre (STAKES) since 1994, interRAI Fellow (1997) and member of EAMA (1998).



**Associate Professor  
Katherine Berg, PhD, PT -  
Canada**

Katherine is Associate Professor and the Department Chair of Physical Therapy at the University of Toronto, Canada, and an Adjunct Associate Professor at University of Waterloo, Canada. Dr Berg is best known for her work in developing the widely used "Berg balance scale". Her research focuses on the elderly and measurement issues, both in terms of outcome measures and quality indicators.



**Dr Nigel Millar - New  
Zealand**

Dr Nigel Millar is the Chief Medical Officer at the Canterbury District Health Board in New Zealand. As part of the Executive Management Team, he provides advice to the Board and management on clinical governance and clinical standards, and provides strategic leadership and professional support for clinical staff in hospitals and community services.



**Professor Anja Declercq -  
Belgium**

Anja has a degree in applied economics and in sociology and a Ph.D. in social sciences. She currently is Professor at the Faculty of Social Sciences of the Katholieke Universiteit Leuven and Project Manager at Lucas, an interdisciplinary research institute

Nigel also spends about 30% of his time involved in clinical work at Princess Margaret and Christchurch Hospitals. Specialising in geriatric and general medicine, Nigel is a graduate from the University of Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

**Professor John Hirdes -  
Canada**

Dr Hirdes is the senior Canadian Fellow, a Board Member of interRAI ([www.interrai.org](http://www.interrai.org)), and chair of the interRAI Network of Excellence in Mental Health (iNEMH). He also chairs the interRAI Area Network of Canada, a collaborative network of researchers and graduate students from across Canada. Dr Hirdes led interRAI efforts to create several interRAI instruments including the Contact Assessment, Mental Health, Community Mental Health, and Intellectual Disability instruments. He was also the lead researcher in development of the System for Classification of In-Patient Psychiatry, the Method for Assigning Priority Levels in home care, and Home Care Quality Indicators (as co-PI). He is a member of the interRAI Instrument and Systems Development committee that produced the new suite of instruments and care planning protocols. He has also recently been appointed to the Board of the Seniors Health Research Transfer Network (SHRTN) in Ontario.



**Dr John Morris, PhD - United  
States of America**

John holds the Alfred A. and Gilda Slifka Research Chair at the Hebrew Rehabilitation Center for the Aged, in Boston, Massachusetts, USA, where he serves as Co-Director of the HRCA Research and Training Institute. He leads the instrument development process within interRAI. Among his extensive list of achievements, he has developed and tested quality indicators for long term and post-acute care. Recently, he has lead development of an interRAI wellness assessment system for retirement communities.



**Professor Len Gray -  
Australia**

Len Gray is Professor of geriatric medicine at the University of Queensland. Within interRAI, he has lead development of the interRAI Acute Care since 2003, rebuilding the instrument and adapting it for use in geriatric consultation and ward care. He has combined his interest in assessment systems with his work in telemedicine, developing systems for "online" assessment and support for video-consultation.



**Dr Brigette Larkins, PhD,  
Med, MNZSTA - New Zealand**

Brigette is Senior Project Manager for the Ministry of Health in New Zealand leading the national implementation of the interRAI Home Care and Contact Assessments across the District Health Boards. Her work experience includes clinical, policy, management and academic roles. She has a Masters in Education from Canterbury University in NZ and a PhD in Speech Pathology from the University of Queensland, Australia. Brigette is Adjunct Senior Fellow at the University of Canterbury, holds Honorary Lecturer status with the University of Auckland, and is an Associate Member of the Communication Disability Research Centre, University of Queensland. She has a special interest in the rehabilitation of acquired neurogenic communication disorders and has worked clinically in this field. Her research interests focus particularly on the speech pathology application of the World Health Organisation ICF model, and functional communication assessment. Brigette led the Canterbury District Health Board initial pilot of the interRAI HC and the subsequent implementation of the Home Care and Contact Assessments within the District. She was invited to become an Associate interRAI Fellow in 2008.
